
Milestones of Methodist Mission (MM)



The Paya Lebar Chinese Methodist Mission (PLCMM) Story and Mandate

The story of PLCMM is a story of stepping out by faith in response to a call and also a sending out by the larger family of God - PLCMC.

The Call and the Sending Forth by the larger PLCMC Family

Rev Seet Keng Tat's recollections...

"I remembered very clearly that at the LCEC planning retreat in January 1998 when the LCEC Chairman, Mr Ong Heng Kok proposed a task force led by Mr. Lim Soo Chin to study into the setting up of a worship service at Paya Lebar MGS (Sec), that I had a very strong prompting from the Holy Spirit that God wanted me to take up such a task of organizing a worship service at the school premise. But I did not tell anyone except Jeffrey Teo about what I heard from God.

It was only sometime in August and September of that same year that I was asked by the LCEC Chairman, Mr. Ong and Mr Lim Soo Chin to lead a group to set up a worship service at the school. I agreed as I had already heard God's call in January."

"The opportunity for our church PLCMC to start a worship service came at the invitation of Mrs Lee Siew Choo, the principal of Paya Lebar MGS (Sec) as the Paya Lebar Methodist Church who had been using the school for their worship services had in 1998 completed their church rebuilding and was expected to move to their new church building", recalled Mr Lim Soo Chin.

In January 1999, the PLCMM was formed with Seet Keng Tat as its chairman and Ong Eng Keong as the vice-chairman and Rev Daniel Lee Kwang Yong as the advising pastor. A group of about 25 brothers and sisters comprising mainly members worshipping at the English worship service and some members from the Mandarin worship service came forward to form the core congregation of PLCMM.

With the help and support of the mother church the rifle range of the school was converted into a worship hall at a cost of about \$160,000. The first worship service was held at this worship hall called the Emmanuel Hall in August 1999.

The Mandate of PLCMM from the Beginning

Right from the beginning of PLCMM. the mandate to set up a worship service at the Paya Lebar MGS was to reach out to both the school's student population and to the residents and families in the Lorong Ah Soo HDB neighborhood with the gospel of Jesus Christ. To pursue its mandate and mission, PLCMM appointed Jasper Sim as its first fulltime student ministry staff to work with the students of the secondary school. PLCMM also embarked on community penetration programs and activities and started its free tuition service for primary school students of the school and the Lorong Ah Soo neighborhood.

Children's Ministry

The children's ministry of MM started without much fanfare in year 2000, in one of the classrooms of the PLMGS Seconday school block with a handful of our own leader's children. Lessons were conducted in a Sunday school style in a small group setting.

As we began to connect with the residents of Lorong Ah Soo, we realized that many of the families had children who were struggling academically in school. Their parents lacked the financial resources to provide for external tuition. They were also either too busy or were not equipped to help their own children with their work. With this genuine need in mind, we started the Tuition Ministry in 2001 with approximately 25 students on Saturday afternoons. Brothers and sisters from MM congregation and a few from the PLCMC congregations availed themselves to be tutors for the primary and secondary school students.

As the student enrolment grew, God showed us that this was a natural "door" to channel children and their families into our midst. Hence, we shifted the tuition hours to Sunday morning, so that the tuition students could then stay on for children's church. We also realized that to attract and retain children from non Christian homes, it was crucial to have a more hyped up and energetic program. With that, MPK (Mighty Power Kids) was born in 2005.

MPK operates as a "hybrid" children's church/Sunday school with praise and worship, bible stories and age appropriate teaching with updated teaching aids. On alternate weeks, we have small group sessions by level where teachers are able to connect deeper with the children. We also endeavour to

inject fun elements into our program by having activities such as outdoor games, cooking and excursions with the parents. Aside from reaching out to the LAS community, God also opened the way for us to bless PLMGS(Pri) through our holiday camps. We have held four large scale camps in years 2005, 2011, 2012, 2013, averaging 150 to 300 children, and we never fail to be amazed at how the children dedicate their lives to God during these camps!

Through this "dual prong" method, we have had the privilege to minister and touch the lives of many children, and their parents through our weekly interactions with them and home visitations. A few of the children from our community who joined MPK have grown to serve in some ministries, even taking up leadership positions in youth. Through their children, some families have also received Christ and joined our congregation On the other hand, we have also experienced large numbers of children who spend years with us, receive salvation but sadly, leave us after their primary school education.

Over the years, the attendance has reached a high of 80+ to the current 30+. The drop in student attendance was more apparent in the last two years. This could be the result of a growing proliferation of affordable tuition in the market. However, one thing remains clear - many parents continue to send their children to us as they recognize that our tuition and MPK teachers operate differently from commercial centres and schools. Our teachers teach with passion and love their children with Christ's love. Despite being non-believers themselves, the parents do appreciate the character values we imbibe in their children.

Our hope for the ministry is that our tuition service will remain relevant to the academic needs of the community children. And that even as the tuition ministry opens the door for us to engage and minister to the children on a spiritual level, God will empower us to preach the Gospel to them, so that we may bring salvation to them and their families, and bring them into the MM family.



Growing up as a Christian teenager in Singapore has not been the easiest thing to do. There is a constant struggle between becoming what the world wants us to be and what God created us for. This fight within the youths is so overwhelming and more often than not, we feel so defeated and helpless by how effortless sin takes over us, time and again. The good news is we are not alone and one of the main reasons why MM Youth Ministry exists is to bring the fellowship of young Christians closer to God to glorify Him in all our ways.

In our modern world where consumerism is king, it is an uphill task to capture the attention of young ones and draw them closer to the heart of God. Also, MM is a church that embraces and welcomes diversity. We encounter people from all walks of life and it is difficult to pitch our service to cater to individuals with different spiritual maturities. Attrition rate has been a menace to modern churches across the board, resulting in a "flat organization structure" in the body of Christ. It remains a fervent prayer and effort for all of us to raise a new generation of godly leaders who are deeply rooted in the Word of God.

God has been faithful to MM from the start of this ministry. He prepared His godly and faithful servants to guide and serve these young lives. For over a decade, MM Youth Ministry has been there as a family and a refuge to all whom we have come across. A place we call home where bonds are fostered and hearts are warmed.

MM Youth Ministry started off with our Church Leaders' children studying and learning the Word of God together. Gradually it included the children from the neighbourhood. Today we have an even mix of both groups serving God and growing spiritually together.

It is heartening to see the youths taking up their responsibilities, making use of the talents God has given them to serve one another. We continue to hope and pray that more will rise up to take their place and work as part of the body of Christ for the kingdom of God. Beyond that, we want the MM Youth Ministry to continue to be a place where youths can come together to experience life and God in a special and enduring way.

WORSHIP

MM was known as the Preaching Point, PP for short, in its infant days. The MM Worship Service started with a group of about 10 to 12 members from the English Congregation of PLCMC. It was a simple time of fellowship, somewhat like cell meetings. These members would meet in the afternoon at the canteen of PLMGSS after their regular Sunday service at PLCMC. That was in early 1999. Soon after, MM started its first English Service at the riffle range in PLGMSS – Emmanuel Hall.

With a call to reach out to the predominantly Mandarin speaking residents in Lorong Ah Soo, MM started a Mandarin Service alongside its English Service. The worship style was contemporary for both services. It was a real challenge, both in terms of manpower and resources, for the group to run both services. Despite the difficulties, members stood together and continued to serve selflessly and sacrificially. Sometime in 2003, in order to bring greater focus in its outreach work in Lorong Ah Soo and to optimize its manpower and resources, MM decided to have only 1 service - the Mandarin Service.

For a group of English speaking believers, to worship and pray in Mandarin was a mammoth task. Worship leaders would spend days selecting the songs after careful consultation with fellow worship leaders. The worship team practiced hard as they had to familiarize themselves with the Mandarin praise & worship songs. Prayer during praise & worship was kept simple initially as the worship leaders gradually learnt to lead by faith and in the spirit.



MM's worship style is unique. Not only do we worship in contemporary songs with the drums, keyboard and guitar, we also worship the Lord in dance. Worshipping the Lord in dance started as early as 1999 when MM had its first rally. The ministry grew and now we have a team that worships together with the worship team every Sunday with both the tambourine and streamers.

The Lord is good. He has blessed MM with a dynamic worship team. Visitors and non-believers are often drawn to the upbeat and colourful worship style of MM. The worship team has served the Lord faithfully all these years. Some members have served the Lord in this ministry since the birth of MM.

MM grew from its humble beginnings to where it is today purely by God's love and grace. Seeing a growing number of youths and English speaking members in its midst, MM restarted its English Service in mid 2013. Today, MM has both Mandarin and English Services running concurrently at 2pm. Membership was not affected and continues to grow steadily.

一个没有围墙的教会!

超过80 %的宣教站成员都个 别属于细胞小组成员。因为

是宣教站,我们就是要来到社区里与这里的居民分享福音。多年来,我们已经在罗弄阿苏结识了许多家庭,成为他们生活上的一部份分。

我们开始时设立了三个以华语为主的细胞小组,它今天已发展到四个华语细胞小组和三个以英语为主的细胞小组。宣教站也有一个特别的小组团契,那就是在每逢周三晚上十点半至凌晨十二点半的聚会。主要是为着一群大约十四人的厨师而设立的。他们应着要长时间工作,而且周末也要开工,只有在十点半过后才能参加聚会。



在门徒栽培方面,宣教站认识到要有效的分享见证及传福音给他人,有组织有规律的门徒教育是不可缺少的。宣教站在2004年为当时的先锋领袖们开办了第一班为期34周的红本门徒课程,由伟仁弟兄带领,通过研读圣经,学习作主门徒应有的标志,进一步的了解有关门徒属灵生命成长关键的原则,学习委身的功课。

从那时开始,门徒课程便成为在小组以外, 宣教站会众预备在教会的各样事工上事奉 前一个必要的培训过程。也有许多人为了要 更深一步认识圣经而参加,而许多人也因着 这个课程体会到上帝的公义与慈爱,更激发 他们立志回应上帝的大使命,作个忠实的门 徒。

Evangelism & Outreach Community



At the heart of MM (Methodist Mission) and its various ministries, is evangelism - reaching out to the lost through the sharing of God's love. MM's call is to reach out to the community in Lorong Ah Soo. It's works center around sharing Christ with friends and families in Lorong Ah Soo.

Over the years since its birth, MM has come to befriend many families in Lorong Ah Soo through its Tuition Ministry, Mighty Power Kids, Cells, its various Community Outreach events, just to name a few. MM has become a household name in Lorong Ah Soo and these friends have come to know MM in a personal way, some of whom grew up in MM as youths and are now worshipping faithfully in MM and serving with fellow brothers and sisters in Christ in MM. Amen to that!

In the early days, as part of its effort to share God's love in a real way, some members through their cells would clean the corridors of some blocks in Lorong Ah Soo. A cell even went to wash, paint and gave a facelift to one of the resident's flat. Tuition teachers in its Tuition Ministry would make the extra effort on Saturdays to give additional tuition to the weaker students who live in the community. Cells would meet at the void decks and some would meet in the homes of residents in Lorong Ah Soo in order to bring the light and love of Christ closer to these friends. There were block parties, durian feasts, Mid Autumn celebrations and distribution of mooncakes at

the various blocks, MPK Camps, Christmas gatherings and caroling etc. all were but for only one reason – that more may come to experience the love of Christ and come to receive Jesus as their Lord and Saviour. Members would brave the flights of steps, up and down the various blocks just to knock on doors, distribute flyers and invite their friends in Lorong Ah Soo to join them at an outreach gathering.

MM has hosted several community outreach events. The most recent one is the Chinese New Year Outreach Event on 15 February 2014. For the first time in the history of Community Outreach work in PLCMC, the church witnessed the gathering of approximately 750 non-believers in its midst. It was by far the largest community outreach event hosted by MM. The event took place at PLMGSS. Members from across the various congregations in PLCMC came together in concerted effort, participated and made this event a possibility. During its preparation, members from different congregations gathered to worship, pray and intercede with each other. What an awesome sight it was! The church stood together with one heart and mind, with a common goal and purpose.

Evangelism and Community Outreach are the heartstrings of MM. This is where the pulse of the church is and it will remain so for many years to come.

Missions

MM had its first taste of overseas missions in 2005 when Rev Louis Chai, the pastor in charge of MM then, brought a group of about 5 brothers and sisters to Inner Mongolia for a 'missions exposure' trip. The team helped out at a Summer camp where local children and youths came to learn and improve their command of the English language. Team members served and ministered with fellow believers from America and China. They shared the gospel and prayed with the local youths. For the first time, they broke bread and had holy communion with the extended family of God. They sang hymns and worshiped the Lord together in their own ways. Despite the differences in culture, experience and background, there was unity and a common purpose, a meeting of hearts and minds, brought together by the same God whom they believe and call "Abba Father". It was awesome and an eye-opener! from this initial exposure trip, unknown to the team, the Lord planted His first 'seed' of missions in MM.

In 2009, Tji Leng brought Agnes, Henry, Sylvia and Karen to Prey Veng, Cambodia, to join in a well digging program his polytechnic was involved in. That paved the way for MM's mission work in Prey Veng. Our mission work in Prey Veng is a partnership with

Operation Hope Foundation, a local NGO.

In March 2010, a member of MM opened the way for MM's mission work in Prey Veng, Cambodia, with a field trip with his school to dig wells in the village. In partnership with Operation Hope Foundation, a local NGO, MM organised its first mission trip to Prey Veng in 2011. A total of 54 members - young and old, from between 3 and 74 years of age - signed up for MM's maiden mission trip, which also included a handful of brothers and sisters from PLCMC's other congregations. It was a 'family' mission trip to share the gospel with the orphans in Hope Village and the villagers in Prey Veng. The team also built 2 houses for 2 families in a village nearby. Members rolled up their sleeves together with the locals and completed the 2 houses in 4.5 days, an amazing feat completed purely by the grace of God. Many were motivated, encouraged and for some, moved by the spirit of God, as they saw the love of God and His mighty hand at work in their midst. The Lord's favour and protection were evident. There were no casualties at the building site and no one fell sick during the entire 8 days at Prey Veng. The team ate and slept together, played games together, sang and worshipped together. It was



unforgettable, seeing brothers and sisters serving the Lord as a family and in the bond of God's love.

MM organised its second trip to Prey Veng in 2012. The team of 34 continued with the work of the earlier team in the preceding year. A new house was built in another village and the friendship with the children and youths in Hope Village began to grow and take root. Last year, we saw yet again an amazing number of 54 members who signed up for the third trip, not only members from MM but also from Contemporary Service (CS), Bilingual Service (BS) and Litigical Service (LS). 2 families in Prey Veng were blessed with new houses and the children and youths in Hope Village have come to regard us as their friends whom they hold close to their hearts. To these young ones from Hope Village, we have become messengers of God's love, hope and a new life.

Missions is the call of the church. It must continue. As we go out by faith to share God's love, may He establish His Kingdom on earth as it is in heaven.



LS Families

"For the Lord is good; his steadfast love endures forever, and his faithfulness to all generations." - Psalm 100:5 (ESV)

The Liturgical Service is a place for the whole family – mothers, fathers, children and grandchildren. It is a place where the presence of extended families bears witness to the truth of God's loving faithfulness to all generations, as it says in Psalm 100. It is also a place where families have been called to live in faithfulness to Jesus Christ, by humbly bowing before the Father in heaven, "from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named" (Ephesians 3:15).

Like the rest of Paya Lebar Chinese Methodist Church, the Liturgical Service is a network of families, many of whose multiple generations extend across the diversity of PL's different worship services. Each family in its own way is a testimony to the power of Jesus' touch, so that when one family member experiences God's love, accepts him and comes into the church, others in the family also feel the touch, and want to come to the Lord.

One example is the family of Mdm Tan Hwee Hwang. According to Jocelyn Chng, her mother, Mdm Tan Hwee Hwang grew up in a Christian family. When she married her husband Chng Kee, Mdm Tan threw herself into the family food business that, by God's grace, continues to flourish today. Unfortunately, over the course of the years, raising six children and helping her husband to grow the business, she drifted away from the Lord and from church life.

Jocelyn recalls that it took a series of crises and challenges before her mother came back to the Lord and became a member of PLCMC. First, her husband passed away in 1988, leaving behind a family business and the challenge of raising those six children on her own. Jocelyn was then in university, and began running the business. But then her mother fell ill and had to be hospitalized. When Christian friends began praying with her, she decided to return to the Lord. Finally, it was when Kathleen and Chang Yao Liang were looking for a place to get married, that they discovered PLCMC. Rev Chong Chin Chung reached out to them and performed the ceremony, and since then the family has continued attending here. The mother prefers to worship in the Hokkien Service, but she often joins other family members in LS, though her English is limited. She continues to pray for and urge her







now grown children to seek a closer walk with God, along their spouses and the grandchildren. All of the six children are Christians, while four are PLCMC members worshipping in the Liturgical Service, Jocelyn, Kathleen and her husband Yao Liang, Claire and Wilfred with his wife Serene. Among them, there are 11 children, nine of whom attend LS. Two of Jocelyn's siblings, Cheryl and Tony are attending other churches.

Sadly, Jocelyn lost her own husband, Richard Wong in 2004, leaving her to raise three boys on her own, which she had done with the constant encouragement of her mother. Even in the midst of challenges and sometimes tragedies, God's grace has prevailed. Jocelyn remarks, "I have to give glory to God, and give all the credit back to Jesus."

Adelina Ong also has much to be grateful for. Her family has over five generations in Paya Lebar Chinese Methodist Church. Her parents Ong Tian Soo and Sim Sai Mui were married at PLMC (Boundary Road) in 1948 and have been a part of PLCMC since it moved to the present address, attending the Hokkien Service. Meanwhile, her four daughters, Billie, Lafone, Chloe and Demi, are active in the Liturgical Service, along with her granddaughter, LeNel.

Adelina has been coming with them to this church since 1967. She recalls happily the prayer meetings with former pastors, Rev Tan Peck Geok and Rev Goh Chiao Ti.

Her deep desire is to continue the legacy of her parents and grandparents and to ensure that the legacy of commitment to God is not lost in the next generations. She says, "I am continuously attending church and I've brought the next generations and will ensure that the next generation will continue."





Brief Introduction to Bilingual Service (BS) Kelvin Goh





By God's grace, BS was born on 11 Jan 2009. It is a contemporary service conducted in both English and Mandarin. The average attendance of BS today is around 75, comprising mainly youths and young adults / families.



在一次年议会主办的堂会学校联席会议里,有一位校长说出了他心中的感叹,因为他们的教师团队大多比较年长,因此不敢也没能力举办适合少年人与年轻人的活动,因此失去了很多吸引及栽培年轻一代的机会。反观巴耶黎峇的堂会学校就有很多朝气蓬勃的年轻老师,做起青年事工也多姿多彩。

我对这位弟兄的观察颇感意外,也把这件事默默的记在心里。在回家的路上,往脑海的记忆里翻了一番我们堂会学校现有的组织图表,赫然发现,我们的老师团队的确拥有很多年轻人。原来我们平时看似平常,一向来都没注意到这样的一个现象,却如此受到他人的注意和羡慕。原来当我们把它看为理所当然的时候,却没发觉到上帝一直如此眷顾着我们的堂会学校!

因此,我们当为上帝所赐给我们的两方面的恩典而感恩。







三代同堂的堂会学校

根据堂会学校的组织图表算了一算,原来我们不单有很多年轻人,教职员团队里还拥有三代人!年轻的老师从18岁到25岁有15位,25岁到35岁的有10位,35岁以上的老师有25位,60岁到80岁的也有5位!至于学生,从幼儿到乐龄共约250位。

我也观察到,有年纪大的老师带领着幼儿,年轻老师带领着年长学生的情况。在这儿,年龄基本上没构成任何界限,大家凭着各自的能力,上帝的感动,在各个岗位上服事和教导。

多元化的堂会学校

最近我拜访了几位教会前辈,询问关于我们堂会学校的建校史。60年代初期,巴耶黎峇卫理公会主日学原设于Boundary Road的牧师楼,由王英丽姐妹开办。初期,学生基本上是小朋友,而且是英文班。后来逐步发展华文班,以及成年班,再后来才有乐龄班和幼儿班。听几位前任校长的分享,他们的语气、表情,严肃又认真,丝毫没有自我夸耀的心态。我突然深深的感受到,在任职期间,他们是那么敬业乐业,战战兢兢的把上帝所交托的主日学逐步建立起来,然后小心翼翼的交付下一代,唯恐学校毁在他们手里。

今天的堂会学校级别有:幼稚级、少年级、青年级、成年级以及乐龄级,还有例外的如路得班。路得是摩押的寡妇,因为爱婆婆和敬拜耶和华的心,决定离开家乡跟随、照顾婆婆,为后人留下了好榜样。堂会学校因此决定以"路得"命名2011年开设的女佣班。在女佣班里,来自各国的女佣和老师们都互称姐妹,不曾把对方视为化外人,堪称是一个融汇着不同种族的大家庭。

今天,我们的堂会学校又面对着什么挑战?



Serving in the Youth ministry constantly reminds me of the days of my youth. Indeed the stories that would be shared by the youths from 20 years ago would in many ways still sound unmistakably familiar to the youth of today. Similarly, the experiences of the youth today would also bring a strangely warm feeling of nostalgia to the youth of 20 years ago.





Each year the youth continue to meet on Sundays for fellowship and Bible study; each year we have our youth camps; each year we have our games and activities. Everyone who has been through this ministry will have their own stories and experiences to share that is centred on a time of life that everyone goes through – the days of youth. This shared story and experience through the generations is what makes this very unique and unusual family one.

The six or so short years that a youth spends in this ministry can go by just like that, and soon it is time to move on to another stage in life. Senior Citizens Fellowship

During the late 1980s, a group of God-fearing and dedicated brothers and sisters led by Mr Ong Heng Kok, Mdm Ang Geok Kie, the late Mr Koh Kok Hua, the late Keng Soh (amongst others) were concerned that many of the senior church members had no opportunities to meet and interact for fellowship except only on Sunday Church Services. They therefore embarked on the mission of finding an avenue for the Seniors to meet regularly apart from the Sunday Services. They therefore started the Senior Citizens Fellowship for the Seniors to meet regularly. On 20th September 1987, the Senior Citizen Fellowship was officially launched.

The objectives of the Fellowship were to foster care and love among the Seniors, edify one another with God's Word, strengthen the faith of each other, live in harmony etc. To achieve these objectives, monthly fellowship meetings were organised where various Christian topics were expounded by invited speakers; outings were also organised every now and then.

Membership was opened to church members aged 55 years and above. Those aged below 55 years were also welcomed to join in the activities organised by the fellowship. Many in the fellowship had encountered hardship during the Japanese occupation of Singapore from February 1942 to September 1945. Their faith was severely tested and they emerged victorious. Praise the Lord!

The members originally were from the Hokkien service. Praise be to our Lord, we now have members from the Mandarin, Teochew and English services. And membership has grown to around 100.

The Fellowship was successful in engaging the seniors through interesting programmes. Fellowship meetings were well supported throughout the years.

Many in the leadership also hold important positions in the LCEC. Thus the Fellowship is able to work very closely with various agencies and provide leadership.

Apart from the planned monthly fellowship meetings, the fellowship organised trips out of Singapore. We have short (1 day), medium (2-3

days) and long outings (7 days). We have been to various parts of China such as Beijing, Shanghai, Xiamen, (just to name a few), Vietnam, Thailand, Taiwan, Malaysia, Indonesia and Australia.

The members were encouraged to keep healthy and fit. Thus we have talks on health topics by doctors and nutritionist. An exercise centre was also set up for the members to exercise.

The fellowship works closely with the WSCS and supported each other in our respective programmes. We have joint celebration fellowship/services such as Chinese New Year, Christmas and Parents' day, and others as and when planned.

Financially, the fellowship is independent. All activities and programme are self-funded. We are thankful to our Lord for the members' generous support. We are able to provide financial support to Mission Works, Social Concern, Outreach and Trinity Theological College if called upon.

陈玉卿 成年团契团长 时光荏苒,我参加成年团契已有20多年,记忆中历任会长(恕我不按年份排序)有宾升泰、袁嘉民、林添翔、黄声杰、刘汉昌、罗文基等,他们殷勤的付出塑造了今日成年团契的发展、壮大的可喜规模。

成年团契的功能在于巩固成年人对于教会的 归属感与委身感,因此成年团契应成为成年 人与会众及教会各肢体联系的一个平台。感 谢上帝,因为众弟兄姐妹在这方面的共同努 力,我们成年团契所举办的各种活动都取得 了不错的成果。至今为止,成年团契主办的 主要活动计有:

新春捞鱼生,为教会夫妇提供重立婚姻誓言、重拾浪漫感情的温馨情人节,2014年的LEGOLAND欢乐亲子游,中秋节聚会,为加强亲子关系而给繁忙的弟兄姐妹及家人提供到大自然探索及休闲的家庭郊游,各类属灵知识讲座,以及福音见证会,如李南星见证会等。

这些活动一方面加强了教会各肢体弟兄姐妹的联系与团契,进一步巩固"教会是我家"的温馨氛围,另一方面正如华委主席文基弟兄所言,成年团契发挥了火车头的作用,带动其他肢体一起参与全教会性的大型活动,打造"基督里一家"共同事奉的火热禾场。我们为着上帝的带领而感恩,也为着成年团契的明天而战战兢兢,不敢丝毫懈怠。

科技的飞速发展让我们应接不暇, 也改变了 我们沟通与交流的方式。例如Face book等社 交网站变革了现代人交友的方式, 而人际关 系却不再那么容易深入,快速又刺激,却流 于肤浅。对基督徒而言,大型教会(Megachurch)的兴起也改变了许多敬拜的方式, 家庭式的教会组织似乎在新的时代显得有些 落伍了。同时,我们对职场、家庭、子女教 育投入了更多时间,许多人似乎已经抽不出 时间来建立及巩固与上帝及与人的关系。再 者,现代青年人的自我意识膨胀,似乎很 难为传统的教会活动所吸引,成年团契的活 动也很少花时间来参与,以联络感情、促进 友谊,成年人与青年人之间的代沟因此越来 越明显。这些问题是众教会所面对的共同难 题,它造成了成年团契成员老龄化、后继乏 人的棘手局面, 这是成年团契所面对的最大 挑战。

综上所述,继续寻找更好更适合新情势的节目内容,探索更新更有意义的活动,以凝聚成年团契现有的中坚力量,并吸引更多年轻一代的成年人参与成年团契的活动,乃至加入成年团契的服事团队,将是成年团契今后努力的方向。愿上帝激励我们,彼此扶持,将成年团契打造成更具活力,更讨上帝喜悦的教会中坚力量!





反向宣教初熟的果子 五谷团契

- 耶稣说: "所以, 你们要去, 使万民作我的门徒, 奉父、子、圣灵的名给他们施 洗。" (太28:19-20)
- 随着时代的改变,世界经济一体化的进程加快,原本未听闻福音者大量涌进城市。 传福音的使命,呼召了新加坡一群上帝的仆人,展开了一项新的事工:向门前禾场 传福音,谓之曰:反向宣教。

成立背景

- 五谷团契始于2007年。当时每隔一段时间,就有一 批在中国受过良好教育的资讯科技专才来到新加坡。 他们就如同没有牧人的羊,需要喂养和带领。于是就 在蔡尚志牧师和师母的带领下,由五、六位对中国人 事工有负担的人自愿参与,诱过郊游、探访、英文课 程、洗礼分享会、乒乓球赛等形式,邀请他们来教会 参与活动,做一些松土和福音预工的工作。
- 当时,诱过嘉明弟兄联络的护士团契,也每年从中国 征募受训护士到新加坡来,教会的弟兄姐妹则成为她 们的导师(Mentor)。弟兄姐妹也将她们带领来教 会,加入于后来成立的五谷团契的生活中。
- 随着越来越多的中国父母将孩子送到海外受教育,我 们也接触到许多陪读妈妈和孩子,他们在孩子上学、 住宿及生活上遇到许多的困难,需要一些帮助,透过 教会的弟兄姐妹带领,也加入这个团契中。如此,参 加团契的新朋友人数和事奉的工人皆与日俱增。



命名与异象

- 为了帮助这些来自远方的朋友,也回应上帝的呼 召, 使万民做主门徒, 使更多的中国人听到福音的 好消息, 五谷团契于2010年1月正式成立。
- 团契的名称是取自约翰福音4章35-36节,主耶稣 说: "你们岂不说:`到收割的时候,还有四个月' 吗? 我告诉你们,举目向田观看,庄稼已经熟了,可以 收割了。收割的人得工价,积蓄五谷到永生,叫撒 种的和收割的一同快乐。"

































事工与活动

- 持续不断的福音预工:英文课程、生活讲座、郊游、体育活动、生活辅导与关怀、节庆活动等。
- 福音聚会和见证分享: 个人布道、见证分享、福音影片、启发课程、布道会。
- 门徒训练:导航会门训课程,大使命门训课程、团契、查经班、小组。
- 福音分享主要对象: 专业人士、学生 (IT、护士等)及教会弟兄姐妹所接触 的中国朋友。
- 最初,五谷团契接受洗礼的弟兄姐妹并不多,每次洗礼人数2至3位,而且因为工作的关系,他们流动性很大,在短短的两年时间,在本堂受洗后回国或转入其他教会事奉的超过十多位。当然更多的人是留下来事奉。
- 目前,透过"五谷"的栽培,受洗的 人数已经接近40位;留在五谷事奉的 有近20位。
- 启发课程:为了使我们传福音的事工 更有果效,我们在不断检讨的基础 上,于2010年引进了启发课程。由 于五谷团契的资源和能力有限,先是 向本堂英文现代崇拜学习,后得到华 委各个肢体,以及妇女会、堂会学校 等的大力帮助和积极参与,该年7月 31日——启发课程的宣传日,效果出 人意料,超过200人出席。接下来每 次课程,每次都有超过60人出席。课

程结束后,共有18位弟兄姐妹决志信主,同年圣诞节有9位弟兄姐妹洗礼。

2011年4月复活节,9位接受洗礼者中,有7位是透过启发课程和启发跟进课程而来的弟兄姐妹。2011年的启发课程之后,也有超过10位参与课程的弟兄姐妹洗礼归主。

2012年,启发课程于5月26日至8月 19日举行,有8位弟兄姐妹决志信 主。

- 五谷团契也透过英文班、福音布道会、郊游、见证分享会等多种灵活的形式,将人带到上帝面前。同时,也积极装备有潜质的弟兄姐妹,逐步安排《门徒》训练及其他课程训练,并将他们差遣到不同的事奉岗位锻炼,以应对事工扩大的需要。



总结
